How Filimin Works

Filimin is a Wi-Fi enabled touch light that connects you with those you love, across town or across the globe. Use Filimin to say "good morning, good night, I'm thinking of you, I love you"...you decide. First, loved ones you'd like to connect with become members of your Filimin group. Then, when one member of the group touches her light, all the lights in that group will light one of hundreds of colors together! Any member can respond, touching their Filimin, and all the lights will change color. Without interaction, Filimins fade over time.

Setting up Your Filimin

Before you use your Filimin, you need to configure it for your Wi-Fi, then group it with other Filimins owned by those you love. **Go to our setup page at <http://filimin.com/setup>** and we'll walk you all the way through the process.

After completing the basic setup, you can choose a color range for your Filimin. That way, each member of your group can have their own unique color range so you know who is reaching out. You can also choose how long it takes for your Filimin to fade off. And you can even set sleep times so that your Filimin doesn't disturb you while you rest.

Using Your Filimin

Once your Filimin is set up, using your Filimin is easy: just touch the shade anywhere (sides or top). You will be instantly connected to your loved ones.

Filimins sense the surface area of your hand. They don't like to be poked so use your whole hand when reaching out.
